Elder Network has been as busy as bees too, and to help with our efforts, we have welcomed several new staff to the team: Jen Roslien, Program Coordinator for Friendly Visitor in Olmsted County; Michael Brody (a friendly voice you will hear working with Donna and Dawn in Transportation for Olmsted County); and Nancy Wegner, Senior Advocate Assistant. We are thrilled to have them joining us!

An important focus for us over the summer and fall this year, will be our educational opportunities for clients, caregivers and the public. Dementia Friends Info Session, Dementia Champions, After the Diagnosis for those newly diagnosed with dementia; a Caregiver Workshop on planning for the Unexpected; Powerful Tools for Caregivers and more. Many of the educational offerings have expanded into Dodge and Goodhue Counties. With support from South Country Health Alliance, we have been able to provide more programming in

these counties for older adults and caregivers. Group Respite provides caregivers a break, while their older adult care receiver gets socialization in a community setting. We currently have space to add new participants to our Kasson Group, and are looking to develop additional Groups in other towns. Call us to learn more and/or to join Group.

Our clients tell us they have many concerns with the rapid pace of change that has happened in recent times-such as increasing food and housing costs, and fewer resources. Sometimes, there are few, easy answers, but I can tell you that there are so many good people and organizations that are working hard to address the aging needs in Minnesota. The Minnesota Blue Print on Aging was rolled out last fall and many work groups across the state have formed to work on the ideas in the Blue Print-including Elder Network. Locally, Elder Network also works on the following groups: The Falls Prevention Coalition and Olmsted County Aging Coalition-to name a few. The Falls Prevention Coalition is working hard to educate the community on how to prevent falls, and increase strength and balance. Special programming will be offered during Falls Prevention Month in September. Elder Network also worked with a local developer to invite older adults to meetings, to provide feedback on a low-income housing plan for older adults that they are hoping to build in Rochester. It was amazing to see the give and take in the meetings, and to see how the plans evolved-based upon this feedback.

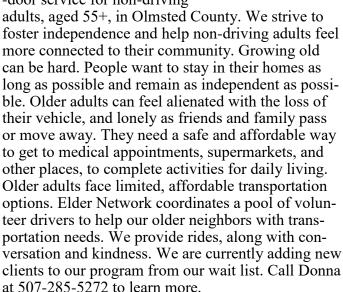

Updates from Our Staff Members

Kate-Olmsted County Senior Advocate



Estate planning and end-of-life planning are intertwined processes that ensure your wishes are followed regarding your assets, finances, and healthcare-both during your lifetime, and after your passing. While estate planning primarily focuses on the management and distribu-

tion of your assets, end-of-life planning addresses healthcare decisions and final arrangements, as you approach the end of life. The truth is, that everyone should think about having these pieces in place as soon as they become adults. Many people do these things through a lawyer. Unfortunately, income limitations can seem like a barrier to many. Through a Partnership with Legal Assistance of Olmsted County, we Partner to help put on Free Wills Clinics every Spring and Fall. Our Advocate can also aid people in walking through the Medical POA and the Financial POA forms. The clients then take the forms to a notary for the validation of their signature. This planning and creation of legal documents is crucial for ensuring your wishes are honored and your loved ones are supported-during challenging times. A regular review of these documents helps them reflect any changes.

Holly-Caregiver Respite & Supports

Caregiver Respite is an important service that provides relief for the caregiver to complete out-of-home tasks, while confident that their loved one is with a competent, trained individual. If you are interested to learn more, please call 507-285-5272 and ask for Holly.

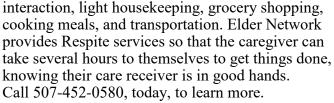
"After Caregiving Ends, Now What" Support Group
